

WHO-GoI Joint Monitoring Mission and Mini-Epi review

World Health Organization (WHO), the Government of India (GoI) and other technical and donor partners conduct a Joint Monitoring Mission (JMM) every three years to review and assess India's Revised National TB Control Programme (RNTCP). Since the programme's inception, there have been six such missions. The last one was undertaken in April 2015.

Dr Anurag Bhargava was invited as member of JMM team to review the progress, challenges and plans for India's TB control efforts, and advise on the pathway towards achieving Universal Access to TB care in the context of implementation of the National Strategic Plan 2017-25 for TB Elimination by 2025. Before the commencement of JMM, this year Mini Epi Review has been planned from 04 to 10 November 2019.

Dr Anurag contributed as country lead for the thematic group, 'Multi Sectoral Engagement and Patient Support Systems'.
